On a Journey of Hope in the Philippines

Holistic Transformation is at the heart of IN-HOPE. Since 2021 we come alongside vulnerable village communities with the deeper goal to see families flourish so they can, in turn, build stronger communities. Our holistic approach seeks to support them not just physically, but also emotionally, spiritually and socially. When people flourish in these areas, they become agents of positive change within their communities.

IN-HOPE collaborates with local partners who selflessly support their own people towards sustainable progress. The partnership is grounded in shared values and a common vision. Transformation is the long-term goal: freedom from poverty, sickness and injustice for all under our care. Sustainability is central to our approach. Ownership of all initiatives remains with the community: we invest and support for a limited time to enable lasting change.

The Family Program

Our competent and committed field coordinators live within the community where they serve, assisted by volunteers. 120 families are provided with school materials and educational support up to secondary level. We invest in what we call "Care Growth": weekly classes for children and parents where we discuss practical topics to improve family life. These gatherings offer a space to draw strength and courage from the Bible, nurturing both faith and resilience. Occasionally we supplement their pantries with food items and provide medical and/or dental check-ups once a year.

The Livelihood Program

Together with selected community stakeholders, we develop small business initiatives such as the "Agree to Agri"-Farm, which provides additional income for families and the "Hope-Hub" Computer Center, which supports children who do not have access to computers for their schoolwork. //

Cristina Arcipe

Cristina is one of four IN-HOPE students in Mascap who successfully advanced from Junior to Senior High School recently. Her family earns a very modest income through farming on borrowed land. They live on a mountaintop, and every school day Cristina walks half an hour just to reach the tricycle stop that takes her to school.

Recently, Cristina represented her school in a track and field competition. She was the only female participant from her school—and despite not having proper running shoes, she placed second.

We have met Cristina and her family twice. Before receiving support, they were forced to borrow money just to pay her school fees. Today, IN-HOPE helps shoulder part of this financial burden, easing the strain on her family.

Cristina is active, determined, and deeply motivated to study. Our field coordinator says: "IN-HOPE helps her to reach her dreams and develop her full potential." //
